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About this template

This template is for **managers and SMEs** who want to keep good people by fixing issues early — before they turn into resignations.

Who it's for

- Managers running 1:1s
- HR/People Ops supporting retention
- Team leads in high-turnover roles or peak-season teams

How to use it (15 minutes)

1. Pick 10–15 employees to start with (high impact roles, strong performers, or teams under strain).
2. Run it as a **30-minute conversation** (not a survey).
3. Ask the questions, take notes, and end with **one concrete action**.
4. Track themes monthly (if the same issue repeats, it's a system problem).

 **Frequency:** Ideally 1–2x per year per employee, plus after major changes (new manager, re-org, peak season).

!!Tone rule: This is not an interrogation. It's: “Help me make this a place you can thrive.”

What to listen for (quick guide)

✓ Strong retention signals

- Clear growth path
- Manageable workload
- Predictable schedule
- Feeling valued and listened to

🚩 Risk signals (early warning)

- "Nothing changes here"
- "I'm always covering gaps"
- "I don't know what good looks like"
- Repeated schedule chaos or overtime spikes
- Lack of fairness in shifts/time off

- Tools/process friction

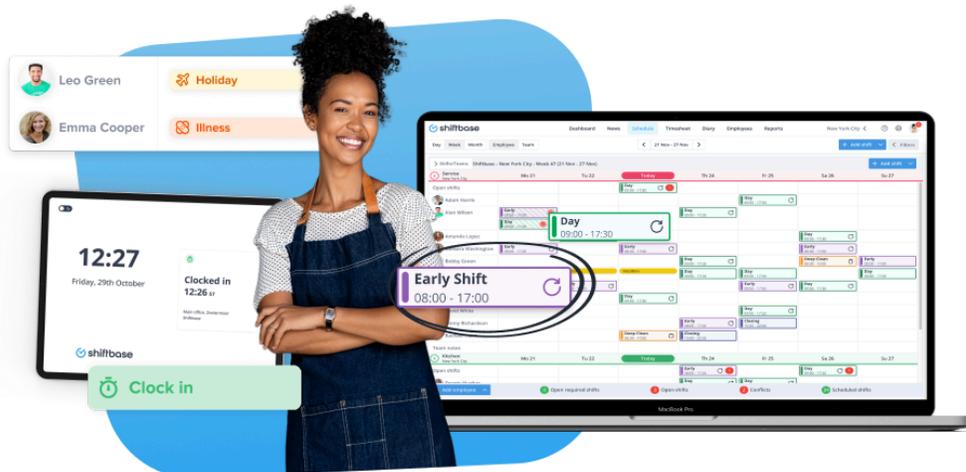
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
